October 16th-17th

Explore one of Oak Ridge's *best kept secrets* - greenways and trails

## Saturday, October 16th, 9:00am, Cedar Hill Park on Michigan Ave

Secret City Trekker Program kickoff at 9:00am sharp! Refreshments will be served.

Volunteer-led hikes will be offered immediately after the kickoff. We may divide into groups based on interests. The amount of walking will depend on the weather and interest. Hikers should wear comfortable, sturdy shoes and appropriate clothing. Hikes will be held rain or shine!

What trails will we hike today?	Where will we meet today?	How far will we hike?	What will it be like?
Cedar Hill greenway	Immediately after the kickoff at Cedar Hill Park.	Up to 2.5 miles, with shorter options	Shady, wooded path and neighborhood sidewalks
North Ridge Trail	Immediately after the kickoff at Cedar Hill Park.	Up to 4 miles, with shorter options	Shady, wooded path. Some steep hills on longer options.
Haw Ridge Park	Immediately after the kickoff at the kiosk on Edgemoor Rd	Up to 4 miles, with shorter options	Shady, wooded path near the lake. Rocky sections, and some hills.
North Boundary greenway/Wheat District greenway dedication	1:30pm, Horizon Center Business Park, ~4.5 miles west of Illinois Ave on Hwy 95/58, on right	Up to 7 miles, with shorter options available.	Primarily gravel roads. Shorter options are flat, longer distances have some hills.

## Sunday October 17th, 1:30pm, Clark Center Park

Two volunteer-led hikes will be offered. We may divide into groups based on interests. The amount of walking will depend on the weather and interest. Hikers should wear comfortable, sturdy shoes and appropriate clothing. Hikes will be held rain or shine!

Freels Bend or Gallaher Bend greenway	1:30pm at Clark Center Recreation Park, South (toward lake) from intersection of Scarboro Rd and Bethel Valley Rd. Right through gate. Follow road approximately 3 miles to Clark Center Park at lake. Parking on right.	Up to 5 miles, with shorter options available.	Jim Evans, TWRA, will lead a guided tour of the restricted Freels Bend on the Oak Ridge Reservation. Both hikes are on gravel roads and some wooded paths. Gradual hills on longer distances.
